Extra! Extra! Read All About It!


"I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people!"




pies for the sale which is being held virtually due to CoVid-19. We had prayer for many who are unable to attend due to health



A FALL RECIPE!

Oriental Coleslaw

This is a really good recipe from Marty Miller

1 16 ounce bag of shredded coleslaw mix;

4 green onions, thinly sliced;

1 3oz package of chicken flavored Ramen Noodles, broken up;

4 teaspoons of toasted sesame seeds;

½ cup oil; 1/3 cup vinegar; 1 Tablespoon sugar; 1/8 teaspoon

pepper;

½ to ¾ cup almond slivers;

¼ to ½ cup shelled sunflower seeds.

Up to 1 hour before serving, combine coleslaw mix, onions, Ramen Noodles (save seasoning packet for dressing), almonds and sunflower seeds in a salad bowl. Cover and chill.

In a shaker jar or blender, combine oil, vinegar, sugar, pepper, and seasoning mix from the ramen noodles. Cover and shake. Chill.

At serving time, shake dressing again, pour over salad and toss to coat.

Note: if you make this ahead, do not add the Ramen noodles until 1 hour or less before serving time. You want the noodles to be crunchy.

PUTTING THE SCRIPTURE IN TODAY'S WORLD

Jeremiah 4

- 1 "If you, United States of America, will return, then return to me," declares the Lord. "If you put your detestable idols out of my sight and no longer go astray,
- 2 and if in a truthful, just and righteous way you swear, 'As surely as the Lord lives,' then the nation will invoke blessings by him and in him they will boast."
- 3 This is what the Lord says to the people of: The United States of America "Break up your unplowed ground and do not sow among thorns.
- 4 Circumcise yourselves to the Lord, circumcise your hearts, you people of the United States of America and inhabitants of its cities, or my wrath will flare up and burn like fire because of the evil you have done—burn with no one to quench it. Disaster from the North.
- 5 "Announce in the United States of America and say: 'Sound the trumpet throughout the land!' Cry aloud and say: 'Gather together! Let us flee to the fortified cities!'
- 6 Raise the signal to go to the Lord your God! Flee for safety without delay! For I am bringing disaster from the street thugs and rioters, even terrible destruction."
- 7 A lion has come out of his lair; a destroyer of nations has set out. He has left his place to lay waste your land. Your towns will lie in ruins without inhabitant.
- 8 So put on sackcloth, lament and wail, for the fierce anger of the Lord has not turned away from us.
- 9 "In that day," declares the Lord, "the politicians and the officials will lose heart, the priests will be horrified, and the prophets will be appalled."
- 10 Then I said, "Alas, Sovereign Lord! How completely you have deceived this people and the United States of America by saying, 'You will have peace,' when the sword is at our throats!"
- 11 At that time this people and the United States of America will be told, "A scorching wind from the barren heights in the desert blows toward my people, but not to winnow or cleanse;
- 12 a wind too strong for that comes from me. Now I pronounce my judgments against them."
- 13 Look! He advances like the clouds, his chariots come like a whirlwind, his horses are swifter than eagles. Woe to us! We are ruined!
- 14 United States of America, wash the evil from your heart and be saved.
 - How long will you harbor wicked thoughts?
- 15 A voice is announcing from Dan, proclaiming disaster from the hills of Ephraim.

- 16 "Tell this to the nations, proclaim concerning: the United States of America. A besieging army is coming from a distant land, raising a war cry against the cities of the United States of America
- 17 They surround her like men guarding a field, because she has rebelled against me," declares the Lord.
- 18 "Your own conduct and actions have brought this on you. This is your punishment. How bitter it is! How it pierces to the heart!"
- 19 Oh, my anguish, my anguish! I writhe in pain. Oh, the agony of my heart! My heart pounds within me, I cannot keep silent. For I have heard the sound of the trumpet; I have heard the battle cry.
- 20 Disaster follows disaster; the whole land lies in ruins. In an instant my tents are destroyed, my shelter in a moment.
- 21 How long must I see the battle standard and hear the sound of the trumpet?
- 22 "My people, the people of United States of America are fools; they do not know me. They are senseless children; they have no understanding.
- They are skilled in doing evil; they know not how to do good."
- 23 I looked at the earth, and it was formless and empty; and at the heavens, and their light was gone.
- 24 I looked at the mountains, and they were quaking; all the hills were swaying.
- 25 I looked, and there were no people; every bird in the sky had flown away.
- 26 I looked, and the fruitful land was a desert; all its towns lay in ruins before the Lord, before his fierce anger.
- 27 This is what the Lord says: "The whole land will be ruined, though I will not destroy it completely.
- 28 Therefore the earth will mourn and the heavens above grow dark, because I have spoken and will not relent, I have decided and will not turn back."
- 29 At the sound of rioters, street thugs, and distant armies every town takes to flight. Some go into the thickets; some climb up among the rocks.

 All the towns are deserted; no one lives in them.
- 30 What are you doing, you devastated one? Why dress yourself in scarlet and put on jewels of gold? Why highlight your eyes with makeup? You adorn yourself in vain. Your lovers despise you; they want to kill you.
- 31 I hear a cry as of a woman in labor, a groan as of one bearing her first child the cry of the United States of America gasping for breath, stretching out her hands and saying, "Alas! I am fainting; my life is given over to murderers."
