

Purer Than Pure, White As Snow

WASH ME.

AND I SHALL BE WHITER THAN SNOW

Just a couple of weeks ago, we got our first snow here in central Indiana. It wasn't much, but it was enough to get my transplanted Nevada kids excited for winter. Of course, I tried to remind them that Indiana kids may not be as excited as they were for the first snow of the season. I can't say I shared their enthusiasm for snow (I like it OK just perhaps not as much as they do). But I did get excited reflecting on a truth that the snow brought to mind.

Snow has a history of making a recurring appearance in scripture. I'll list some examples of what I mean in just minute. But before I do, can you think of any?

Here's a verse from a very well-known Psalm that mentions snow. "Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow." (Psalm 51:7 NIV)

David's intention here is simple. The color white is often associated in the Bible with purity and, obviously, snow is a good, universal example of something that is white. But let's dig deeper. He doesn't just want to be white. He wants to be whiter than snow. Not merely pure, but purer than you can imagine. Further still, he knows this is unachievable by human means.

Being a "church-goer" will not purify you. Being a "good person" will not purify you. Being of a certain political party will not purify you. Being Mennonite will not purify you. Not even being a king can purify you. Just ask King David, the man who wrote this Psalm. According to David, only God can do that, and he looked forward to the day when God would make him purer than pure. In his words, "Whiter than snow."

With this in mind, let's jump to the Book of Revelation, specifically chapter 7. I won't put the whole text here, but I encourage you to read the entire chapter. As you do so, slow down a bit when you get to verse 9.

Here John mentions that he sees a "great multitude" of people, apparently from all over the world, as evidenced by their various languages and nationalities.

As you read on you will see that they are wearing robes, but not just any robes – white robes. But they weren't always white; they only got that way after being washed. Verse 14 says that what made them white was being washed in the blood of the Lamb. It was this passage that inspired the famous hymn you've probably sung a time or two "Are You Washed in The Blood?" by Elisha Hoffman. What

David longed for in Psalm 51, what John described from his vision in Revelation, what Hoffman knew to be true when he penned his hymn in the 1800s, was perfectly offered by Jesus on the cross as the Lamb who was slain.

When I reflected on the snow we got in November, my mind drifted to the

scriptures. Specifically to the promise that as far as God is concerned, I am no longer filthy because His Son, King Jesus, has made me pure – more specifically, whiter than snow.

How about you? To quote Elisha Hoffman, "Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb?" He didn't write a hymn titled "Can You Be Washed in The Blood of The Lamb?" but rather "Are You Washed in The Blood?" It's actually one of the most important questions you could ever be asked. And the answer is even more important than the question. It is my hope that you are able to say "YES!" to that question because you have come to love and trust Jesus as your Savior and your King.

So, the next time snow falls (and I know it will because I'm no longer in the desert), instead of grumbling about how annoying or treacherous it can be, let it serve as a reminder that because of Jesus you and I – as well as anyone willing – can be made clean and pure. Indeed, whiter than snow.

Updates from the Church Office

A few new policies and procedures will be rolled out at the beginning of 2022. To get everyone prepared for these changes, here is a list of items that will be rolled out (over time):

- There is a new rental agreement for use of our facilities. Members and regular attenders may still schedule birthday parties, showers, reunions, etc. at no cost. However, if you are renting the facility for a funeral or wedding, the facility costs will be waived for members and regular attenders but cleaning fees and other service fees (audio, video capture, musicians, etc.) will now apply.
- 2. When scheduling a family event, shower, birthday, etc. there will be a form in the office to fill out. It needs to be turned in and approved before it will be officially added to the church calendar. Please do not add an event without first filling out the new form and getting approval through the church office.
- All committees must submit a list of committee members and their positions, normal meeting times, and minutes for each meeting held. If there are changes to a meeting time, please alert the office if time allows so it can be corrected in the bulletin.
- 4. Please put all mail for the church office and for Pastor Will in the designated mailboxes hanging outside the office doors. This will help ensure urgent and time sensitive material is seen immediately. You may continue to use their family mailbox for personal communications.

Please be patient as we roll out these new items. There will be more information as each item is rolled out. We understand this process will take time to get used to and will provide detailed information on where to find forms and who to call with questions.

Tractor for Peace Update

Kaufman Mennonite Church (Davidsville, PA) was blessed to host Pastor Nehemiah (Nemi) Chigoji from September 29 - October 4.

A former professional soccer player, he was excited to share at Johnstown Christian School during Jr. High and High School chapels and ride along for a Girls Soccer game.

Pastor Nemi also helped lead a series of local revival meetings. On Saturday Nemi shared about the work of the Anabaptist Peace Center in his home town in Nigeria. He is working with widows whose husbands have been killed due to the conflict between Muslims and Christians. (All of the widows' husbands were Pastors.) Currently they are helping these women with Micro Business loans, housing and stipends for a two year period on order to help them get reestablished, and farming in order to grow food.

In addition to the material needs, they are also helping them with counseling and health care costs. A few of the Kaufman men who attended Nemi's Seminar at ReGen 2021 were so inspired by his sharing there about the farm work at the Peace Center that they committed to helping raise funds to purchase a new tractor for the work.

Part of Nemi's visit was to celebrate this accomplishment and to help him learn how to use the tractor. Thank you to the other Evana Congregations who sent gifts to help us reach our goal. The tractor has been purchased and will be delivered later this winter once all the paperwork is completed!
